A Word From Our Associate Pastor

"In contemporary society our Adversary majors in three things: noise, hurry, and crowds. If he can keep us engaged in 'muchness' and 'manyness' he will rest satisfied." Richard Foster wrote those words in his book *Celebration of Discipline* in 1979 and I think our society has just become even more noisy, even more hurried, and full of even more crowds. This "noise" distracts us from so many things in life but most importantly it distracts us from the still small voice of God. The noise keeps us from being the people God intends for us to be. But there is a cure to all the noise, SILENCE. Silence is a beautiful thing. It isn't something we need to fear. We don't need more noise to fill our lives; we need silence to bring peace, comfort, and the presence of God into our lives. Now this is not an easy task. We are conditioned to seek out noise but here are a few steps you can take to reduce the "muchness and manyness."

- ◆ Take 5 minutes in the morning to sit in the silence. Don't check your phone, don't turn on the tv, don't put on music. Just be still.
- ◆ Leave the radio off in the car as you drive and use the time to pray (with your eyes open) in the silence
- ◆ Talk less and listen more
- ◆ Stop for 10 minutes during the day to just sit in silence and listen for God.

Try one or all of these things and see what a difference it makes in your life. See the many ways God can use the silence to speak to you.

Attention all Men with Daughters- You need to read this!

I try to live my life in such a way that I have very few regrets. I think I have done very well at that over my life because I have very few things that I regret. However, one of them is that I did not have an opportunity to get an official Men's Ministry going here at St. John's. The Men's breakfast is a great thing, but I am passionate about men working together to study God's Word and learning how to be strong followers of Jesus while becoming the man, husband and father that God intends for us to be. It simply took a backseat to bigger picture items. I regret that I will not be able to do that before I leave.

However, I would like to offer something for some of the men of this church that has been immensely helpful to me as a father to daughters. Starting Tuesday May 5th then on May 12, May 19, and then June 2, June 9 and June 16 (at a time in the evening and place to be named later.) I invite all men with daughters to be a part of a study based on a book by Dr. Meg Meeker called, *Strong Fathers, Strong Daughters*. Dr. Meeker has spent over twenty five years practicing adolescent medicine and counseling teenage girls and their parents.

This book literally changed my perspective on my role as a father in the life of my daughters. Here is a quote from page 1 Chapter 1 *You are the Most Important Man in Her Life*.

"Your daughter needs the best of who you are: your strength, your courage, your intelligence and your fearlessness. She needs your empathy, assertiveness, and self-confidence. She needs you.

Our daughters need the support that only fathers can provide and if you are willing to guide your daughter, to stand between her and a toxic culture, to take her to a healthier place, your rewards will be unmatched."

So if you have a daughter or one on the way, you need to be a part of this book study. I promise, it will change your perspective on being a father to a daughter. The only cost will be that of the book, ten dollars. I believe in this so much that I will refund your ten dollars from my own wallet if you think it is a waste of time. Three Tuesday nights in May and three Tuesday nights in June will be a great investment of your time, money and effort to read the book.

This study is based on sound biblical principles but it is not really a Bible study. This would be a great way to introduce some of your friends with daughters to the idea of a church family and to help them learn to be better fathers to their daughters too. A Word From Our Director Of Contemporary Worship

The story of God is a story of restoration. Easter is the answer to right man's wrongs from the beginning.
