



Happy New Year! This is the time of year when people traditionally make new resolutions. Many people make promises to themselves that they will lose weight, go on diets or eat healthier, begin exercise regimens, or quit a bad habit. Many resolutions come in the form of a goal. We are able to obtain some goals and others remain allusive and we may eventually give up on them.

The Apostle Paul talks about setting and pursuing goals in his letter to the Philippians. He writes, "Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Beloved, I do this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus (3:12-15)." In his letter to the Hebrews, he writes, "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfector of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God (12:1-2)."

As we look to the new year that lies ahead of us, and the goals that are set before us, may we run the race worth running. May we pursue the one goal that is life changing and life giving. May we gain more and more of Christ and the righteousness that is found in faith with every new day that passes.
