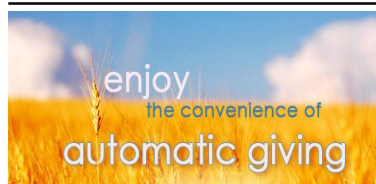
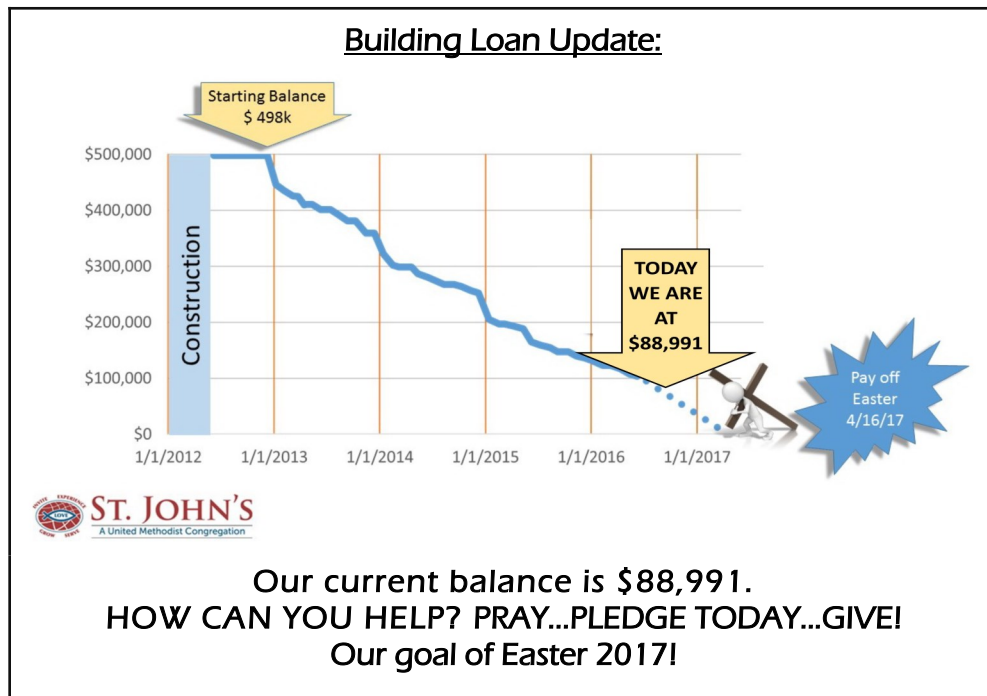

A Word From Our Pastor

As I write this, it is late in the evening on All Saint's Day, November 1st. As I enter into my office, I can hear John Wesley whistling as he is packing up his belongings from this evenings events. Now, before you think me crazy and get ready to ship off to the infamous funny farm, let me explain. This evening we had the joy of witnessing "The Man from Aldersgate," a one man play performed by BJ Johnston. There were about 50 in attendance to witness a heartwarming performance. We journeyed together through the thoughts and memories of John Wesley. From the earliest memories of the fire that took his childhood home and almost took his life to his conversion at Aldersgate where his heart was strangely warmed, to his bold preaching on his father's grave. So, as I'm in my office, BJ is in the conference room packing up his things, or John Wesley's things...

The message that John Wesley brought us, is that we are saved by faith in Jesus Christ alone. Even the most vile and lost can be found and redeemed through this faith in Jesus Christ. And with this faith comes affirmation of God's love and salvation. One of the memories that Mr. Wesley shared with us, was when he was held up at gunpoint by a highwayman. The man told John to give him all his money or his life. So, John gave him the money, but that's not all. John also told him that the blood of Jesus covered a multitude of sins, even his! And that the robber didn't have to live this kind of life. He could be changed! Later on in John's ministry, a man he did not recognize came up to him and asked him if he remembered a time when he had been held up by gunpoint. John affirmed the memory. And then the stranger proclaimed that he was the man! He was the man that held John up at gunpoint and he was also the man that heard John's words that day. And his life was changed and he had become a follower of Jesus Christ.

Towards the end of November, when all the leftover turkey is tucked away in our fridges and freezers, we will enter into the season of Advent. A season of waiting for the coming of Jesus, the ultimate gift of God's unfailing love and mercy. We wait for the One, whom we know has come and is coming. The Christ that comes for each one of us. The savior that extends forgiveness for each one of us. The One whose blood covers a multitude of sins. The one who calls the least, lost, broken and forgotten into a redemptive healing relationship. This is the One in whom John Wesley preached and in the one we are called upon to have faith alone. May God continue in that redemptive work in each one of us that all of our hearts may be strangely warmed!

Town Hall Meeting...Planning for the future...

Early this year, a planning team developed a vision for St. John's. The vision was to continue to make St. Johns a family-focused church where love abounds, successfully creating disciples for Christ and actively reaching out and ministering to the community around us. A key part of attaining this vision is the creation of a preschool. A preschool has been a dream of St. John's for many years. In fact, our current building was built with it in mind.

Why do we want a Preschool? First and foremost, it's a chance to help children in our community to learn some educational fundamentals while simultaneously learning about God's love. It's a way to reach out to families within St. John's and in the community outside St. John's.

Our plan is to open our school in the Fall of 2017. We want to provide high quality education including Christian principles. We are targeting to have up to 30 kids, infants through pre-K. We hope to be able to offer scholarships to many families so that cost won't be a barrier. The school will provide services to families, not just their kids. It will be open all day, five days a week, year round.

We are proposing doing this through a joint venture with Mainland Children's Partnership. Mainland Children's Partnership is a local charity that's been around for over 25 years. They manage the Community Family Center at 21st and Palmer in Texas City. It is the sponsoring organization for United Faith Alliance and Susan's Market. The staff at MCP have a strong background in child development and case management.

We are proposing a partnership where St. John's provides the facilities and a day to day director. MCP will provide case management services, a business structure, and funding, including the brunt of the financial risk. MCP will obtain and hold the license and will be the actual employer for the preschool staff.

There are many more details to be worked out but this preschool partnership has the potential to bring great benefits to Christ's Kingdom in our community. If you want to know more about this exciting opportunity, please attend our planned town hall to be held at the Church on Wednesday, November 9th at 7:00 PM. The Town Hall will be immediately followed by an Administrative Council meeting where this idea will be considered for formal approval.
