

#### A Word From Our Pastor

There has been much in the local papers about hurricane preparedness. All the signs are there that we are in the beginning of the Gulf hurricane season. This isn't anything new for me. I grew up in Bridge City. I remember the excitement of evacuating as a small child. At that time I didn't understand the dread on my parent's faces like I do now. Back then I just thought it was a fantastic adventure and an excuse to do something out of the ordinary. In my naivety, I just likened it to a last minute vacation! But then, I was the kid that loved it when the lights would go out. When the house was completely dark, except for the small candles and my dad's old lantern, I liked to pretend that I lived in the days of Abraham Lincoln. I'd grab a book and get as close to the lantern as possible. I'd wonder what it would be like to live without the amenities of electricity or running water. I may have been a pioneer at heart!

Hurricanes are unpredictable. When storms rage in the Gulf, it takes a very educated guess as to what it's going to do. Will it turn into a hurricane? Where will it hit? Will it gain strength or begin to die down before it hits land? When this happens, people begin to scramble to make the best decisions. Should they stay and hunker down or leave town? When preparing for hurricanes, we are preparing for the unknown.

Life can be unpredictable. The storms of life can rage and we can be unprepared for the outcome. These storms can leave us devastated, while we try desperately to pick up the fragments left behind from a tragic loss. There is only one way to prepare for the unpredictability of life and that is to draw close to God. Scripture describes God as our shelter and our hiding place. In the midst of an unpredictable life, God's love for you is steadfast and faithful, never wavering. The Psalmist wrote, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult. (Psalm 46:1-3)"

As we prepare for the waters to roar and foam in the Gulf, continue to prepare yourself for the ups and downs of life by drawing close to God through prayer, study and worship. And God will be your shelter in every storm that life brings.
