A Word From Our Pastor

"By God's great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled and unfading...."

Hope. What an amazing word! Hope is what Christ brings into the world. On the first Good Friday, when Christ died on the cross, everything looks like all hope is lost. We leave Mary, the mother of Jesus, weeping at the foot of the cross with the beloved disciple on Good Friday. But we visit the tomb on Easter Sunday to find it miraculously empty, yet full of hope that flows out into the world with the proclamation carried by the followers of Jesus. The tomb is empty! Christ is not there! He has been raised from the dead! Hallelujah!

As believers, we are Easter people. We live in the faith of resurrection power. And we are challenged to bring hope into the world. We are called to be spiritual leaders inspired by the Holy Spirit. We all belong to the priesthood of all believers. This means we are Christ's representatives to the world. We are the body of Christ. Here are current Opportunities to be of service to our community and to provide **HOPE**...We need your help to serve our neighbors!

Manna Bags – St. John’s UMC’s Mission to the Homeless & those in need of food in our community. During the month of April, please bring canned meats (with pull tab tops), such as Vienna sausage, single serve tuna, ham or chicken, and single serve fruits, such as applesauce, raisins, mandarin oranges, etc., jello or pudding, crackers, individual small snack bags (i.e. Oreos, crackers) jerky, wet wipes and small bottles of water. We will use these items to make Manna Bags that can be handed out to anyone that comes to the church for assistance and also we will make extra for you to take to hand out to people you see in our community that need them. We hope to make 50 bags. Please drop off items in the bin in the Mission area.

You can drop off your donations in the bin in the Ministry area.

The “Blanket Project” is in full swing! We have gotten quite a few blankets already! Thank you for the blankets that have been donated! Keep going! A special thank you to ChristyAnne Dickson and Pregnancy and Parenting Support Center for their generous donation of 35 blankets. This ministry will provide blankets to our Mexico mission project that we are also gearing up for at the end of the year. The goal this year is to provide 100+ blankets from St. John’s.
