August 2018



This fall we will be studying the Gospel of John during Fusion. Out of the four Gospels, the Gospel of John stands out. This gospel is definitely not like the others. So much so that it almost wasn't included in the Bible! It was too scandalous! And now, it is one of the most beloved of the four Gospels. Yet, have you ever wondered why it is so different? Why does Jesus seem so different in the Gospel of John compared to the other gospels? And if the Gospel of John is so different, is there any historical accuracy to the book? We will address these questions, the cultural context of the book, and how the Gospel of John impacts our understanding of Jesus in our lives during Fusion: where scripture and life merge for a deeper understanding.
