MISSION/OUTREACH



"We Love All God's Children" is an initiative of the Texas Annual Conference that we have been called to participate in by Bishop Scott Jones. This initiative for under resourced children is a means through which Methodist Churches can partner with other organizations to provide resources for children related to literacy, health and discipleship (faith-

based learning.) The goal of "We Love All God's Children" is to have 67 percent the churches in the Texas Annual Conference engaged in ministry to under resourced children by 2026.

In response to this initiative, St. John's has chosen to focus on literacy and discipleship. It is a sad fact that students who are unable to read proficiently by third grade are four times more likely to drop out of high school when compared to proficient readers. That number increases significantly when those children come from poverty. This is the reason "We Love All God's Children" was born. St. John's has chosen to partner with **Kids Hope USA** whose mission is to build life-changing relationships one at a time: One Child. One Hour. One School. One Church. Kids Hope believes that the most abundant resource in every church is the capacity for its members to share love and we could not agree more! Their model is set up for person to person mentorship with no agenda and no expectations. Mentors are asked to "Just show up!"

For teachers, giving individual attention to students at school grows harder every year because of larger class sizes and smaller budgets which means fewer adults to connect with more kids. Through the Kids Hope USA program, St. John's will be able to train members to become mentors who will meet with their students for about an hour each week during the school year during school hours. Relationship building activities serve as the top priority, with time spent on academics, fun activities, life skills and life-building conversations. "Together we are better!"
