# The Monitor

Dear St. John's Friends and Family,

The first Sunday in May was amazing! It was the launch of Servolution Mainland. We had 330+ volunteers from 12 churches come together to serve throughout our community and beyond. It was amazing and went beyond my expectations. About eighty individuals from our church went out and joined in, scattering with other passionate Christians across our community. We served in several parks by cleaning up, painting, cutting back trees and bushes, repairing equipment and buildings and graveled pathways. These parks no longer look run down and now look so much more inviting and welcoming to children and their families. We cleaned up a cemetery by mowing, picking up trash and lots of weed-whacking! There is still more work to be done at this cemetery, but our hope is that the surrounding community will continue the work of recovery and it will again become a welcoming place for families to visit their loved one's resting places. Work was done in several homes that were still struggling to recover from Harvey. These families were given a fresh wave of hope as people made great progress in recovering their houses to be made back into homes again. There were several more hands on projects at the food bank: making lots of Kids Packs for children that need meals over the weekends and throughout the days of summer; painting hope signs that will be placed throughout the community; and making plarn mats out of plastic bags for the homeless to sleep on. And even more folks gathered at First Presbyterian/Lutheran Memorial to make heart pillows. Afterwards, we gathered at St. George's Episcopal for a community meal. And all throughout the day, there was this wonderful comradery between folks of different denominations!

For our first Servolution, we rocked it out!! I am so proud of our church for getting involved in something very different. I know it's not easy trying something so different, especially on a Sunday – a day of routine for most of us. I'm proud of all the churches that jumped in and decided to make the same sacrifice. It was a hard decision to not worship as usual for all of us. I'm especially proud of our Mission's Director, Ingrid Clark. She felt God laying it on her heart to bring something that had been happening in Galveston for several years and bring it to her own back yard. Her vision and leadership was invaluable in getting this off the ground. She poured out a lot of passion, energy, and extra time so that an impact could be made in our community. A foundation has been laid out for Servolution to become even bigger next year and for continued growth in the years to come. On Sunday, May 5th, we went out into a hurting community and brought light, hope and a message of redemption.

As followers of Christ, we are called into the reconciling work of God in the world around us. What that means is we address the hurt and pain within ourselves and of those around us, so that healing can be found. This is something that St. John's will continue to do in various ways. In that same spirit, St. John's will be offering a new kind of support group. It's not really a new kind of group, but it's new to us. In the last several months, in preparation of the special called General Conference and afterwards, we found that there are lots of families that are hurting. Some of them have even made the decision to leave St. John's because of their pain. And there are still more that are still discerning whether they should stay or leave. This pain has risen up in both the hearts of progressives and conservatives. The one thing that most of them have in common is that they have family members of the LGBTQ+community. Many of these families wrestle with their own feelings, they wrestle with how to respond with love, and they have wrestled with the church's response to their loved ones. This new support group will address this pain by providing a safe place to tell stories and discovering new avenues of hope, forgiveness and healing through the support of one another. As the church, the body of Christ in a hurting world, God has entrusted the message of reconciliation that began with Christ to us. "So we are ambassadors of Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God (2 Cor. 5:20)." We will continue to serve as Christ's ambassadors in big community service projects like Servolution and in smaller more subtle ways by providing much needed support in a small groups. We are Christ's ambassadors and we will continue to share God's amazing love to one another and throughout our community.
