


#### A Place to Grow—New Studies on Tuesday and Sunday

# The Monitor

**June 2019** 

Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord all the earth. Sing to the Lord, bless his name; tell of his salvation from day to day. Psalm 96:1-2

Believe it or not, we were created mainly to praise God and to proclaim the glory of God for we are the work of God's hands. One of the ways we praise God is by singing. Some of you might be thinking to yourself that you don't sing. What you are really expressing is that you don't believe that you sing well. And then there are some of us that just don't feel like singing at all or we don't feel like singing a song of praise. Sometimes what we have within us is a song of sorrow. Sometimes we just feel too beat down to sing. Music is an emotional endeavor. Music can reflect our emotions and it can impact our emotions. Maybe this is why the Psalmist suggests that we sing a joyful song. The Psalmist knows that if we sing a joyful song, it might just lift our spirits even in those times when we are laden down with sorrow and worry. So, whether we think we can sing or not, it is good to surround ourselves with the music that leads us to praise God with thanksgiving.

I admit that it can be a challenge to praise in the midst of our storms. Even as I write, I feel worn down, tired and a little sad. Earlier this week I received a call from a dear friend, Derrell Lee. Derrell Lee is a member of Chapelwood UMC in Nash, TX. I received this church as my second appointment. We moved to Nash in late 2004 when Ethan was just a baby. Ethan is now 14. So, I was greatly surprised to hear Derrell Lee's voice. Though I loved all the folks at this church, I sporadically kept in touch. It's like this with every move. Relationships and dear friendships are released as new friendships are forged with every move. This makes every move bittersweet. The move from Nash was more bitter than sweet. We were a newly formed family. And I was hurting from my first appointment. That one didn't end well and that is just another story for another time. I found so much healing and affirmation among the people of Chapelwood UMC.

One of those individuals became my ministry buddy. Her name is Nita. As an introvert, I needed lots of support to get out there. So, Nita came alongside of me for most of the visits that I made. We went and visited people in their homes. And we made hospital visits together. We prayed so many prayers together. We shared meals together. Every week, we would take the altar flower arrangement and make smaller arrangements to bring to the people we were going to visit. Nita and I were together at least one day a week throughout my time there. One day, Nita called me in tears to tell me that her daughter, Paula had been diagnosed with cancer. The diagnosis had come too late. Paula would take chemo to help her feel more comfortable, but it wouldn't save or prolong her life. She didn't survive much longer after her diagnosis. Nita was brokenhearted. I visited with Nita and Paula often. And when the time came, I officiated over Paula's celebration of life.


Derrell Lee had called to tell me that Nita now has the same kind of cancer that Paula had. Again, it has been diagnosed too late. She is refusing all treatment, except for medication to ease the pain. Derrell Lee wanted to know if I would call her. It took me a couple of days to get up the nerve. It's been a long time since I had talked to Nita even though she had been such a vital part of my life for several years, while I was in Nash. Derrell Lee called on a Monday. I called Nita on a Wednesday. She is so brave. We talked about Paula, about her diagnosis, about her grand-daughter taking her to her doctor appointments. That part of the conversation didn't last too long before she was asking about me and my family. She wanted to know if we were happy. And I told her, "Oh yes! We are so very happy. Everyone is thriving in Texas City!" We talked about our Chapelwood friends and that she is still going to church. Nita was always the optimist. Always the one praising God in the midst of the storm. She and Derrell Lee sang in the choir. And we always joked that Nita was the positive optimist while Derrell Lee was the pessimistic skeptic. We'd laugh and laugh together.

Before I got off the phone with Nita, I prayed with her. We praised God for the promise of resurrection. And we both proclaimed that God is so good. Even in the midst of death, God is good! And though I am filled with sorrow over the upcoming loss of this dear friend, and even though there were tears threatening to spill down my cheeks as I said my last goodbye and I love you's to this dear friend, I knew that I needed to take a page from Nita's book. I have to continue to sing a song of praise for God is

worthy. And as I sing, my spirit is slowly lifted and my faith is strengthened. God is truly worthy of all my praise, even my sorrow-filled praise that will soon be turned to joy (Ps 30:11).


