Think of a situation recently where you had a crisis, but felt you failed miserably with your prayers when all you could think of was one liners, like Help, Protect, Save, Deliver and Find. Now, those are good words, but you may want more than that.

Think of words you wanted to say and could not think of at the time of crisis. Write these words down in your journal/composition book. Look up scriptures, maybe about "fear." Write down the entire verses in your book, and when you need this you have God's words right before you. Research God's words on your subject of need before you need it. Find words that sound like they could go in a prayer, like

Genesis 1:1 "In the beginning God..." Then thank God for all he has created in your life and your world.

Another I Kings 17:5 "So he went and did according to the word of God." Doesn't that sound like words of a prayer, pray those words as applies to your life.

I Kings 17:13 (and Elijah said unto her) "Fear not, go and do." Expound on that, telling God you are fearful of such and such, and why, and ask for his help.

I Kings 18:12 "the spirit of the Lord shall carry thee." That is a great spring board for your prayer. Say, I thank you Lord that I can trust you to carry me through my situation of.....

As you read scriptures (any scriptures) and a word or phrase speaks to your heart write it down to use in your next prayer. Maybe this would be called your personal prayer book.

I Kings 18:15 "As the Lord of Hosts lives, before whom I stand, I will surely show myself unto him today." Show yourself to God today, Say, "Hello Lord, can we talk?"

Just as suddenly a car came around the corner very fast and struck David and knocked Charlotte into the ditch. I've always wondered why God had me let go of David's hand. I surely would have been hit also. Dave just retired, and he turned 80 on Sunday, so God saved us all. Growing up in South Dakota meant winter activities, and a Methodist Youth Fellowship party took us to a farm close to the Missouri River hills (about 10 miles from home) where we were pulled on a huge sled behind a tractor. We were swung around quite a bit. We all fell off and one of the girls was hit in the temple by the sled. No it wasn't me, but it could have been. I went head first into a snowbank. God has been so good to me. Many of you know about the tree that fell on our cabin in Woodville during Hurricane Rita in 2005. Charles and I were in it praying. Two trees fell on our car and it never got a dent or a scratch. There's not enough time to tell all the ways God has brought me through dangerous situations.

I was so young when I started Sunday school that putting my pennies into the offering plate thanking God for His love was just natural. I still remember the little blue, thin, hardback song books. As we grew, the nickels and dimes grew to quarters. Dad always made sure we had offering. We knew it was a sacrifice. Soon we were taught to use our own baby-sitting money for offering. Today my love for Jesus has grown and so has my tithe. If you've seen the power of God in your life, how can we not return a portion of our wealth to Him through our church? The scripture above is the only one listed in my Mother's Bible in her hand writing. It's the first one I think of always when we talk of stewardship. He truly has blessed me as I've grown.

Psalm 78:1-4

Every Sunday, Ethan would get a dollar to put in the offering plate. This particular Sunday, he had put it in his front little blue jean pocket. It was the time of the offering, and the plate was being passed through the rows and it went passed Ethan and then down the rest of the rows

to the back of the church. When I looked up from my seat up front by the altar, I saw Ethan chasing the offering plate. I found out later from Barney that he had struggled to get his dollar out of his little pocket. The plate had passed him up before he could get it out in time. When he finally did get that dollar bill out, he chased after the ushers, so that his dollar would be included in the offering.

At three years old, he didn't really understand what his dollar would go towards. Ethan just knew that he was giving, because he was taught to give and everyone else around him was giving their money too. This lesson in generosity was a part of his faith formation. And now that he is older, he gives a portion of his own earnings to the church. Generosity is now an expression of his faith. God is faithful. God heard my prayer for Ethan to have a strong faith and my prayers are being answered!

As I think about Ethan chasing that offering plate to the back of the church, I am reminded of God's goodness. We are blessed to be a blessing from generation to generation!
